THHS Unified Track Results

Trabuco's Unified Track team took home several medals at the 2022 CIF SS Southern Division Unified Track and Field Championships on Friday, May 13th at Trabuco Hills. As a Unified team, they finished runner-up in the Southern Division! Several THHS Unified pairs and relay teams advanced to the CIF SS Masters Meet at Moorpark HS this weekend. Our qualifiers include: 1 boys Unified pair in the 100m, 2 boys Unified 4x100 relay teams, and 1 boys Unified pair in the shot put, 1 girls Unified 4x100 relay team, 2 girls Unified 100m pairs, and 1 girls Unified pair in the shot put. We wish them luck as they continue their road to State! The top finishers in each Unified event will advance to the CIF State meet next weekend in Clovis.

As a follow up to the 5/13 news: I'm excited to share with you that 3 Trabuco Hills Unified Track and Field teams advanced to STATE at the Masters Meet Saturday! For the first time EVER, the CIF State meet will have Unified heats in the 4x100, 100, and Shot Put.

We have 1 girls Unified Shot Put pair, 1 boys Unified 100m pair, and 1 girls Unified 4x100 relay team going to Clovis this week to represent Southern Section Unified Track at the CIF State Meet.

This is a HUGE accomplishment for our Unified team, school, district and Section. Trabuco Hills will have more representation for Unified Track at the State meet than any other school in the Southern Section.AMAZING. Nine out of 10 Sections in CIF will have Unified representation at State.

Our teams compete Friday, May 27th at 5:00pm (Unified Shot Put), 8:30pm (4x100), and 9pm (100m) at Buchanan HS in Clovis.

A special thanks to JT Ayers, Dennis Kelly, Daryl Beck, and Carlos Leon for their ongoing support throughout the season, especially this past week. Their support and advocacy for Unified Track keeps us alive and got us here. We are incredibly thankful and grateful for their belief in this program. We have two teams that entered the OCMaker Challenge and won 1st place in their category.

The OCMaker Challenge is put on by Vital Link and is a great place for students to showcase their products and have Professionals give feedback on their products.

The prompt is this:

"Design and build, or significantly repurpose, a product that will solve a problem, need or want."

Students work in teams to identify a unique problem, document their solutions, and present a physical prototype of their invention for evaluation. The products are judged based on creativity, innovation, and marketability. All ideas are unique and students have to complete a preliminary patent search.

We entered in Division B (6-12th grades). There were 11 teams entered. We competed with around 92 teams. Parking is available on campus beginning at 5:00 p.m. on June 2nd. The parking spots in front of the 800 building are reserved for the Board members, PTSA auction winners and dignitaries. Please feel free to park in or on the parking structure also.

Gates to the stadium will be open June 2nd at 6:00 p.m. If you plan to arrive early, you may use a personal umbrella for shade until the ceremony starts. Water and other snacks/drinks will be available for purchase from the stadium snack bar. To enter, you must have a ticket. Tickets are being distributed to the graduates after graduation practice on June 1st.

Graduates report June 2nd at 6:30 p.m. As a reminder, graduates will be reporting to the tennis courts at 6:30 to line up for the ceremony. They should be dressed in cap and gown. (No spike heels on the stadium turf.) Graduates will not be allowed to bring cell phones, purses, cameras, leis, etc. into the ceremony. Only school-sponsored and approved sashes and cords are allowed to be worn with the cap and gown.

<u>Cords/Sashes</u>: Only school sponsored groups with the approval from administration can wear cords or sashes.

<u>Seating</u>: There is no assigned seating for the ceremony. You are welcome to bring a "bleacher seat" as our bleachers do not have back rests. Please don't bring ice chests, chairs, E-Z Ups, megaphones, or noisemakers as we have over 600 students graduating and our stands will be filled to capacity.

<u>Handicapped Accessible Seating</u>: We have limited handicapped accessible seating available on both sides of the stadium. Each handicapped person is able to have one guest sit with them in a chair that will be provided. If the parking lot is full and you need a handicapped seat in the stadium, please tell a parking attendant and you will be allowed drop off access in front of the stadium. We cannot guarantee handicapped parking; only drop off access after the lot is full.

<u>Diplomas</u>: Diplomas will be distributed Friday, 6/3 8:00am-12:00pm at the attendance window. They will also be distributed Monday, 6/9 & Thursday, 6/12 8:00am-10:00am at the attendance window.






