



# El Toro High School – Registration



*for students in 10<sup>th</sup> grade in 2020-21 rising to 11<sup>th</sup> grade in 2021-2022*

Dear current 10<sup>th</sup> grade students and families,

This packet of information is designed to assist you in registering for your classes for the 2021-22 school year. During the 2019-20 school year, most current ETHS students placed their initial choices for next year's courses in their Academic Plan in Aeries. During this spring's Registration process they will just need to confirm the courses they already put there or choose different ones if they prefer, then meet with their counselor to review their selections. The details of the process are on the following pages.

You may recall that last spring we decided to move to an Open Access model for course level selection. That means you will have the option of choosing either regular or Honors/AP for each course in your pathway. To help you make informed decisions that are best for your educational experience while balancing your academic goals and personal well-being, this packet provides you with information about the courses such as our course recommendation criteria and the amount of homework time to expect for Honors/AP classes.

Please note that core academic course level options for English, history, math, and science are Open Access for General Education students through this process, while Special Education students with an IEP will still be placed in those course levels as determined by their IEP team which includes the family.

Additionally, English Learner students who would benefit from classes specifically designed to support them will be identified and placed by our English Learner staff in collaboration with their families.

## **ALL STUDENTS / FAMILIES**

Please review the entire packet and registration video ([available here](#) on the ETHS website under Guidance > ETHS Registration), and discuss course options with your family.

It is imperative that you:

- (1) enter your course selections in the Academic Plan in Aeries between February 8-10
- (2) enter your ranked electives in [this Google Form \(https://tinyurl.com/ETelectives\)](https://tinyurl.com/ETelectives) by February 10.


## ETHS 10<sup>th</sup> TO 11<sup>th</sup> GRADE REGISTRATION PROCESS

- Thursday, February 4<sup>th</sup> through Sunday, February 7<sup>th</sup>: ET students should check the ET Guidance website [here under ETHS Registration](#) for this Registration Packet and the Registration Video. Students and parents should review the documentation and videos to learn about and prepare for Registration. And to learn even more about programs and course offerings, they can also view the videos on the ETHS Showcase website, which will be available as a pop-up on the main ETHS website or [here](#) under Resources > Hybrid & Distance Learning.
- Monday, February 8: Students will hear more guiding information from their teachers about the pathway in their department.
- Monday, February 8 to Wednesday, February 10:
  - o Students should use the last page on this packet to write down their course choices, their ranked elective choices and whether they want a period 1 start time. This form will not be turned in but will help you ensure you have made all your decisions. When you are finished you should take a picture to save it for your records and use it during your Registration meeting with your counselor.
  - o Parents should log into the portal in their PARENT account, as the Academic Plan will not be editable from a student account. This ensures the parent is involved in the registration process and takes the place of a parent signature because collecting signatures is challenging during the pandemic.
  - o From the PARENT portal, families should access the Academic Plan and check the existing course selections to confirm the courses that are already there, or choose different courses if they prefer (see “Academic Plan Instructions” on p. 3-6 of this packet).
  - o Students should also input their ranked electives into [this Google Form](https://tinyurl.com/ETelectives) (<https://tinyurl.com/ETelectives>)  
They will need to sign into their student SVUSD Google account to access the form.  
Include on this Google Form the elective(s) you entered in the Academic plan as your first choice(s) then fill in the rest of the five electives with your alternates.
- February 25-March 5: ETHS Counselors will visit current 10<sup>th</sup> grade students via Zoom during their history class to discuss course selections and Academic Plans privately with each student. Prior to this meeting, students should have already submitted their selections in the Academic Plan, as well as their ranked elective choices in the Google Form linked above. Counselors will meet for a few minutes with each student. A couple of classes may meet with counselors closer to spring break.
- Later in the spring, students’ current teachers will review their course selections and contact Guidance if needed. If a change in course selection is considered, Guidance will discuss the teacher’s input with the family.
- At the end of this process in the spring, students and parents will view the final course selections and have a chance to contact Guidance for any further adjustments.
- Once we close the viewing/confirmation process in the spring, the Master Schedule is completed by a computer program, then the Guidance Team only looks at scheduling conflicts. With over 2,300 students at ETHS it is like a 14,000-piece puzzle; a change in one class creates a domino effect for all the others. **THEREFORE: CHOOSE WISELY, WE WILL MAKE FALL STAFFING DECISIONS BASED ON YOUR CHOICES IN THE SPRING SO THERE WILL BE NO COURSE CHANGES OR TEACHER CHANGE REQUESTS AFTER THIS POINT!** We will however continue to allow a level change up to a certain point after school has started, as long as there is room in the class.

## ACADEMIC PLAN INSTRUCTIONS

Use the biggest screen you can - a desktop computer is preferred, if not then use a laptop or chromebook (but not a phone).

1. [Login to the Parent Portal](#) where you will have editing rights for registration. Student Portals are view-only.
2. Under the “Classes” pulldown menu, choose “Classes” first to review your student’s current schedule.




3. Under the “Grades” pulldown menu, choose “Transcript” to view your student’s transcript to see the grades received in previous semesters.

4. Under the “Classes” pulldown menu, choose “Academic Plan” to view and edit your student’s Academic Plan.



## EDITING YOUR ACADEMIC PLAN - This is how you will select your classes for next year and beyond.

Whether you make any changes or not, **you MUST** click “Submit My Plan For Counselor Review” then confirm by clicking “OK” to save changes and approve the plan.

**DELETE COURSES FROM THE ACADEMIC PLAN:** If your Academic Plan has a class next year or beyond that you do not want, you can delete it by using the trash can that appears in the upper right corner when you hover over the course.



**ADD COURSES TO THE ACADEMIC PLAN:** This can be done two ways.

1. Add course sets by Multi-Year
2. Add single courses

### **\*\*Special Education students with an IEP:**

- Do not choose core academic course levels for English, history, math, or science in your Academic Plan; this will be done through the IEP process. Choose only your electives and PE option - you can use the last page of this packet to write them down if you want.
- Enter electives and PE options into the Academic Plan
  - o 10<sup>th</sup> graders will have at least 6 classes including 4 through their IEP (English, history, math, and science), so enter TWO total classes into the Academic Plan: most will need 1 elective & 1 PE option
  - o 11<sup>th</sup> graders will have at least 6 classes including 4 through their IEP (English, history, math, and science), so enter TWO total classes into the Academic Plan: most will need 2 electives
  - o 12<sup>th</sup> graders will have at least 5 classes including 2 through their IEP (English and American Govt / Economics) — so enter THREE total classes into the Academic Plan: most will need 3 electives

### **\*\* English Learner students:**

- Choose regular (grade level) courses such as English 3 in the Academic Plan even though you might be placed into a more supportive class later.

Click "None" (next to Course) then enter the 4-digit course code number in the box with the magnifying glass.

Select the course you want.

Click "Add to Plan."

You will have options to choose grade level and term. Make your choices, and note that most courses are year long and you can consult the Registration Packet for more information on one-semester courses. Then click "Place the Course."

**Want to start in period 1?** Be sure to add course #9988 "Period 1 Start". It is not an actual class; it is just a mechanism in our system that we use to know which students want to start period 1. If you do not add this course to your Academic Plan you will start period 2.

**IMPORTANT!!** Whether you add courses or not, you MUST click "Submit My Plan For Counselor Review" then confirm by clicking "OK" to save changes and approve the plan.

Note the counselor will not review the plan until they meet with the student in class, so the status will be "Pending Approval" until then.

## 11<sup>TH</sup> GRADE COURSE OFFERINGS

All 10<sup>th</sup> grade students are required to take the following four classes: English 3, US History, Physics or an AP science class, and math. They are required to take a minimum of 6 classes. The following subject information will help you select your appropriate courses. The course recommendation criteria are district guidelines developed by teachers, and the homework time is based on student surveys that were taken in those classes during the traditional 2018-19 school year prior to the pandemic (average times are reported, but times vary by student and may change from day to day). In addition to our courses for Special Education students and English Learners, El Toro High School has the following courses available to juniors:

### ENGLISH (REQUIRED)

El Toro High School has 3 courses covering 2 levels of English 3 available to 11<sup>th</sup> graders:

- Students are recommended to choose **0284 English 3 AP Language** if they:
  - are considering pursuing the AP Capstone Diploma. AP Seminar is a requirement of the AP Capstone program and is embedded in English 3 AP Language. Therefore English 3 AP Language is a required course for all students pursuing the AP Capstone Diploma.
  - have an A, B, or C average in English 2 Honors, or an A average in English 2
  - are prepared to spend an average of 20 minutes per day outside of class time on English 3 AP Language for homework, reading, and studying
- Students are recommended to choose **0296 English 3** if they:
  - have a D average or below in English 2 Honors, or an B average or below in English 2
  - would like less time outside of class time on this class for homework, reading, and studying
- Students are recommended to choose **0210 English 3 Online** if they:
  - Are an independent and self-paced learner seeking a flexible schedule
  - meet the placement criteria for this online class:
    - B or higher in current English class
    - Student must be consistent in completing homework and long-term projects
    - Proficiency in Canvas, Google Classroom, Google Suite, and other online tools is *highly recommended*
    - Current English teacher's recommendation – *if you choose this course and your 10<sup>th</sup> grade English teacher does not recommend you then you will be placed in English 3*
    - Parent approval
  - Note that space is limited for English 3 Online and it is possible some students who choose this class may be assigned English 3 in-seat.

### SOCIAL STUDIES (REQUIRED)

El Toro High School has 3 courses covering 2 levels of Social Studies available to 11<sup>th</sup> graders:

- Students are recommended to choose **0764 AP US History** if they:
  - have an A, B, or C average in AP World History, or an A average in World History
  - are prepared to spend an average of 55 minutes per day outside of class time on this class for homework, reading, and studying
- Students are recommended to choose **0761 US History** if they:
  - have a D average or below in AP World History, or an B average or below in World History
  - would like less time outside of class time on this class for homework, reading, and studying

- Students are recommended to choose **0794 US History Honors/MUN** if they:
  - are currently in 10<sup>th</sup> grade and enrolled in World History Honors/MUN

IMPORTANT NOTES FOR MUN STUDENTS: to alleviate scheduling conflicts, ETHS has created a two-year rotation for MUN students in US History Honors/MUN and World History Honors/MUN. In 2020-21 ETHS offered only World History Honors/MUN to MUN students in both 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade, and in 2021-22 ETHS will offer only US History Honors/MUN to MUN students in both 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade. In 2022-23 we will offer only World History Honors/MUN to MUN students in both 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade again. Therefore, it is important for MUN students to know they are making a two-year commitment to the MUN program for this rotation during 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade.

## SCIENCE (REQUIRED)

El Toro High School has 3 levels of Physics available to 11<sup>th</sup> graders, or they can choose another AP class :

- Students are recommended to choose **1011 Physics of the Universe Honors** if they:
  - have an A, B, or C average in Chemistry Honors or an A average in Chemistry
  - are prepared to spend an average of 30 minutes per day outside of class time on this class for homework and studying
- Students are recommended to choose **1010 Physics of the Universe** if they:
  - have a D average or below in Chemistry Honors, or a B average or below in Chemistry
  - would like less time outside of class time on this classes for homework and studying
- Students are recommended to choose **0670 AP Physics C: Mechanics** if they:
  - have an A in Chemistry Honors and want a far more rigorous and fast-paced Physics course
  - are prepared to spend an average of 35 minutes per day outside of class time on this class for homework and studying
- **0703 AP Biology** if they:
  - had an A, B, or C average in Biology Honors or an A average in Biology
  - are prepared to spend an average of 90 minutes per day outside of class time on this class for homework and studying
- **0734 AP Chemistry** if they:
  - have an A, B, or C average in Chemistry Honors or an A average in Chemistry
  - are prepared to spend an average of 60 minutes per day outside of class time on this class for homework and studying
- **0668 AP Environmental Science** if they:
  - have an A, B, or C average in science honors courses or an A average in regular science courses
  - are prepared to spend an average of 25 minutes per day outside of class time on this class for homework and studying

## MATH (REQUIRED)



*\* Advanced students meeting course prerequisites may enroll in Advanced Placement (AP) courses in any grade level.*

*\* IEP's need to notate anyone not reaching Algebra 2 by Grade 11 will not be in alignment with CAASSP assessment.*

Students enrolled in Algebra 2 Honors in 10<sup>th</sup> grade are recommended to choose:

- **0460 Pre-Calculus Honors** if they:
  - have an A or B average in Algebra 2 Honors and want to study a more rigorous level of pre-calculus
  - are prepared to spend an average of 55 minutes per day outside of class time on this class for homework and studying
- **0458 Pre-Calculus** if they:
  - have a C average in Algebra 2 Honors and want to study a less rigorous level of pre-calculus
  - would like less time outside of class time on this class for homework and studying than in Pre-Calculus Honors
- **0451 Math Studies** if they:
  - have a C or D average in Algebra 2 Honors and want to take upper level mathematics course covering algebra, geometry, statistics, probability, trigonometry, modeling, and introductory calculus (visit [www.saddlespace.org/smithjames/mathstudies](http://www.saddlespace.org/smithjames/mathstudies) for more info)
  - are prepared to spend a similar number of minutes per day outside of class time on this class for homework and studying as compared to a regular upper level math class

Students enrolled in Algebra 2 in 10<sup>th</sup> grade are recommended to choose:

- **0460 Pre-Calculus Honors** if they:
    - have a strong A average in Algebra 2 and want to study a more rigorous level of pre-calculus
    - are prepared to spend an average of 55 minutes per day outside of class time on this class for homework and studying
  - **0458 Pre-Calculus** if they:
    - have an A or B average in Algebra 2 and want to study pre-calculus
    - are prepared to spend a similar number of minutes per day outside of class time on this class for homework and studying as compared to a regular upper level math class
  - **0451 Math Studies** if they:
    - have a C or D average in Algebra 2 and want to take upper level mathematics course covering algebra, geometry, statistics, probability, trigonometry, modeling, and introductory calculus (visit [www.saddlespace.org/smithjames/mathstudies](http://www.saddlespace.org/smithjames/mathstudies) for more info)
    - are prepared to spend a similar number of minutes per day outside of class time on this class for homework and studying as compared to a regular upper level math class

Students enrolled in Geometry Honors in 10<sup>th</sup> grade are recommended to choose:

- **0410 Algebra 2 Honors** if they:
    - have an A or B average in Geometry Honors
    - are prepared to spend an average of 60 minutes per day outside of class time on this class for homework and studying
  - **0409 Algebra 2** if they:
    - have a C or D average in Geometry Honors
    - would like less time outside of class time on this classes for homework and studying
- 

Students enrolled in Geometry in 10<sup>th</sup> grade are recommended to choose:

- **0410 Algebra 2 Honors** if they:
  - have an A average in Geometry
  - take the “Summer Bridge to Algebra 2 Honors” online, self-paced course to learn content covered in in Geometry Honors
  - are prepared to spend an average of 60 minutes per day outside of class time on this class for homework and studying
- **0409 Algebra 2** if they:
  - have an A, B, or C average in Geometry
  - would like less time outside of class time on this classes for homework and studying
- **0411 Algebra 2 Intermediate (“Algebra 2i”)** if they:
  - have a D average in Geometry
  - NOTE: space in Algebra 2i may be limited and reserved only for students for whom it would be most appropriate

## WORLD LANGUAGES (OPTIONAL)

El Toro High School offers three World Languages: Chinese, French, and Spanish. For UC and CSU universities, two years of courses of the same language other than English are required (three years are recommended).

If you have not yet taken a World Language class in high school, choose the level you think is appropriate in your elective choices on the Registration Form, and you will be assessed during the first week of school to possibly adjust your placement level.

If you have taken a World Language class in high school and you want to continue taking the next level, indicate that next level in your elective choices on the Registration Form.

## HEALTH

**(5 CREDIT GRADUATION REQUIREMENT)**

**0300 Health** is a graduation requirement. It is a one-semester class so it must be paired with another one-semester class, unless you take it as your 7<sup>th</sup> class. If you want to take Health in 11<sup>th</sup> grade and want to take only 6 classes, be sure to indicate which other one-semester class you want to pair with Health. Examples of other one-semester classes include **0504 (fall) Athletics, 0513 (spring) Athletics, 0519 Weight Training, 0006 ROP off-campus, 0765 Psych 1A, 0470 Personal Finance, 0018 Student Aide, 0523 Power Walking, and 0325 Healthy Living.**

The Health graduation requirement can also be met by taking **0091 Health Online.**

El Toro High School offers a wide variety of programs and electives for students to choose from. If you do not choose electives, they will be chosen for you. In most cases, the elective courses you select will be on your schedule next year. Exceptions to this would be:

- Too many students signing up for a particular class
- Student does not meet course criteria
- A class may be cancelled due to insufficient enrollment
- A class may not fit into your schedule of required classes

AP Capstone is comprised of two AP courses — AP Seminar and AP Research— and is designed to complement and enhance the discipline-specific study in other AP courses. Participating schools can use the AP Capstone program to provide unique research opportunities for current AP students, or to expand access to AP by encouraging students to master the argument-based writing skills that the AP Capstone program develops.

### What is MUN?

Model United Nations, or MUN for short, is a simulation of the famed international organization, the United Nations. High school students from around the nation represent different countries and debate world issues, competing against other schools, both within their geographic area and from all over the world.

At ETHS, MUN provides an invaluable experience that helps to expand a student's sphere of knowledge and develop an understanding of different cultures and prevalent issues across the globe. It provides valuable skills required to thrive in our ever-changing and globally dependent world, including research, compromise, problem-solving and public speaking abilities.

MUN is not an easy program and requires a great deal of effort to reach success. Along with honors-level history coursework, students are required to prepare for and attend 4-6 days of weekend MUN conferences throughout the school year. Every *normal* year ETHS takes MUN students to a travel conference. In the past, we have attended conferences at UC Berkeley, the University of Chicago, and Washington, D.C.

The AVID program strives to ensure that students have the tools necessary to achieve their academic goals. Each week, students receive instruction focused on writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization and reading. AVID students engage in tutor-facilitated study groups, motivational activities, college field trips, preparation for standardized tests, community service projects, and college/career research activities. Students electing to be considered for the AVID Program must successfully complete the application process and maintain good academic standing in the program per the El Toro High School AVID Agreement. AVID Senior Seminar is a yearlong course for 12<sup>th</sup> grade students.
