

# MVHS Auto in the Winning Circle

Five students from Advanced Auto participated in the annual Orange County Automobile Dealerships Association (OCADA) competition this past Saturday. Each student performs specific tasks at nine different work stations. They are given 10 minutes to complete and record the required information for each task set. A total of fifty students were in the

competition.



The students who represented Mission were Cooper Call, Logan Michel, Andrew Puck, Kevin Stewart and Mason Widner. The top 20 students each earned a \$750 scholarship; all five of our students received that! But wait, there was more! ### **Grad Nite**



on Saturday, and they did extremely well!! Both Chamber Singers and Treble Choir took home 1st place in their divisions, and Chamber Singers

took top honors (highest scoring choir) for the entire competition!! On top of all that, our very own Caleb Smith brought home a medal as top soloist for the whole competition!

## **A Texas Sized Adventure**

Our students had the opportunity to work 1-on-1 with the wonderful faculty at Texas State University, as well as perform at amazing locations like the San Jose Mission (founded in 1720) and 180 feet below ground in the Natural Bridge Caverns! Additionally, both our MVHS Chamber Singers & Treble Choir participated in the Bluebonnet Classic Choral Competition, as the only California school in the competitive field... There, BOTH choirs were awarded the class of Division 1 - Superior ratings, with the MVHS Chamber Singers taking home the coveted Outstanding Performance trophy for the entire competition!

We are so proud of how these students not only performed against programs from states like Texas, Louisiana, New Mexico, and Colorado, but also how they conducted themselves as MVHS ambassadors throughout the duration of time we were in the great state of Texas! Their respect for one another and their willingness to immerse themselves in all that San Antonio had to offer made this choir tour all that more meaningful as we blaze a path back to pre-covid MVHS experiences.





**Island Fun and March Madness** 

Toyon Bay through the Catalina Island Marine Institute hosted our students for the 17<sup>th</sup> year. From March 30<sup>th</sup> to April 1<sup>st</sup>, our Oceanography students with a few invited AP Environmental and Agriscience students, snorkeled and learned through immersive labs (like the algae lab shown left) about the unique island ecosystem just 26 miles across the sea. Students were engaged with

fun activities from sun-up (our sunrise hike pictured lower

right) to sun-down (roasting marshmallows after the night snorkel where students were able to see bioluminescence beneath the waves).

This was our first year back since the start of the pandemic just two weeks before we were slotted to go in 2020. The staff welcomed our group of 32 students with a much less crowded island experience, bunks closer to the shore than in years past, and especially enthusiastic program leaders. Students were able to enjoy tide pooling and eeling (fishing for moray eels in a catch/release manner) as well as a rock climbing and the opportunity to dive off the

dock with a weight belt on the final morning snorkel.
Students created new deep sea species as they considered what

adaptations lie in the abyss, observed and interacted with local marine life including assorted sharks, traversed trails to build comradery and appreciate the local terrestrial life, and enjoy themselves in, for what many consider, their major senior class trip.



March Mammal Madness recently concluded this past April as Mission's Life Sciences and Oceanography departments participated for their first annual competition in the decade run spectacle put on by Arizona State University. The statistics based off cited scientific research were stoatisitically off the hook (March Mammal Madness has an additional unit of measure...the stoat)! Students researched their top picks out of 64 different organisms that were not just limited to mammals. As their slogan states, "If you're learning, you're winning!" Each class period started with a Rodent Roundtable update that showed thrilling reenactments

of what happened in each battle arena. Some contestants were more aware of their combative situations than others as multiple "upsets" abounded. A giant bracket was erected in the library to help all keep track of the latest results. The Pride of Lionesses were the ultimate victors this year and students who accurately predicted the most battles were awarded a bagel/donut party at the end. Truly a delicious end to a month of madness!






