SCHOOL DESCRIPTION

Mission Viejo High School is one of four comprehensive high schools in the Saddleback Valley Unified School District. It was the first high school in this district and admitted its first classes in 1966. The school is located in South Orange County, California, and draws its student population from the surrounding middle to upper-class community as well as lower income housing within a 3-mile radius. Mission Viejo High School is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (six year accreditation to 2024). Mission Viejo High School is recognized for an exemplary array and balance of high-caliber programs including IB, AP, Arts, Athletics, Agriculture, and AVID.

MISSION VIEJO HIGH SCHOOL INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM

IB OVERVIEW

In the spring of 1985, Mission Viejo High School became the first Orange County School to be accepted into the International Baccalaureate Diploma program. In 1987 an MVHS graduate earned the first IB Full Diploma in the county. Currently, MVHS offers 19 IB courses. Students must complete an intense course of study which culminates in six internationally graded exams in the areas of English, Foreign Language, Individuals & Society, Sciences, Mathematics, and Arts. MVHS counselors and IB Program Coordinator advise students to pursue the full IB diploma; community stakeholders believe that the IB Full Diploma requirements represent the most rigorous curriculum capable of producing the highest level of college-ready, critical thinkers.

39 IB Anticipated, Course and Full Diploma students in 2022 • **Of the 20 Full Diploma candidates**, 20 students (100%) earned the IB full diploma • In 2022, MVHS had 129 subject registrations; 95% of exams were passed with **a score of 4 or higher** • The 3-year exam pass rate is 92% • **MVHS students earning the IB full diploma passed** with an average of 32 points: 24 points are required to earn a full diploma • MVHS average exam score in 2022 was 5.09 points • **Highest diploma score awarded to a student**: 40 points out of 45 possible • Higher Level Classes at MVHS: English Literature; History of the Americas; Spanish; French; Biology, Physics, Visual Arts, and Theatre Arts.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

Mission Viejo High School offers 16 Advanced Placement courses. In 2022, 439 students took 736 exams. 74% of students passed with scores of 3 or higher. 11% of exams were scores of 5, 26% were scores of 4, and 31% were scores of 3.

FACULTY

MVHS has 82 fully credentialed teachers with an average of 17 years experience. Guidance personnel consists of 2 Psychologists and 5 credentialed Counselors.

GRADING

Grade point average (GPA) is computed using a 4.00 scale. A = 4 B = 3 C = 2 D = 1 F = 0 Honors (H), Advanced Placement (AP), and International Baccalaureate (IB) courses are weighted in the GPA. Each weighted class is multiplied times .2 and divided by the number of semesters, then added to GPA.

Academic GPA: Includes all classes taken in grades 9-12 except those denoted with an asterisk. Honors and AP/IB courses are weighted.

Class Rank: Saddleback Valley Unified School District implemented a decile student ranking system in the Fall of 2019-20 for the incoming Freshman Class of 2023. A decile ranking system classifies the top 10% of students in the graduating class as a group. It does not identify students by a specific numeric rank. **Students in the top 10% will be recognized as “Graduating with High Honors” and wear a medallion at graduation.**

Decile rank is based on the student’s academic G.P.A. Decile rank is computed at the end of each semester and summer school. Final decile ranks are computed after seniors have completed their second semester courses.

UC and CSU GPA: Includes only courses on approved UC a-g list in grades 10-11 with an extra point added for up to 8 semester courses of UC-approved Honors coursework. UC Honors courses must appear on the UC-certified list **and a grade of “C” or higher must be achieved.**

Cal Grant GPA: Includes all classes taken in grades 10-11 including summer school except those with *. Unweighted.

Total GPA: Includes every class taken in grades 9-12. Honors and AP/IB courses are weighted; used to determine the 1.75 GPA graduation requirement.

MVHS students are aided by a School Community Outreach Liaison, an EL Coordinator, and 1 Bilingual Aide.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Advanced Placement	736 exams were taken in 2022. 74% of students passed with scores of 3 or higher. 75 students were AP Scholars, 20 with Honor, and 43 with Distinction.
Agriscience Program	MVHS Agriscience Program includes demonstrations, lab experiments, public speaking, competitions, after school and weekend activities and field trips. All students in the Ag program take part in the FFA chapter. 65 Agriscience graduates, 5 California State FFA Degrees, and 1 American FFA Degree. Over 265 supervised Ag Experience projects including over 150 vegetable gardens, 10 market sheep, 5 cattle, 12 market pigs, 20 farm management & Veterinary Science Work Experience, 4 Breeding Goat Projects, and 35 small animal & horse care work experience.
AVID	Advancement Via Individual Determination is a four-year, academic, elective program for students in grades 9-12. It is designed to prepare underrepresented, first-generation college-bound students to succeed in college upon high school graduation. AVID provides academic preparation and study skills along with college and career preparation. Students receive academic assistance from college tutors. Each year, the AVID students tour four different colleges and universities. More than half of our AVID students earn a 3.0 or higher GPA, and every AVID senior applies to college. Many of our AVID seniors have earned multiple scholarships to assist in their pursuit of higher education.
International Baccalaureate Science Olympiad	20 full diplomas in 2022. 129 subject registrations; 95% of exams were passed with a score of 4 or higher. Mission Viejo Science Olympiad team competed in the Southern California Regional Science Olympiad Competition. The format for this year was a Satellite Tournament where students competed virtually from their individual schools. 42 teams competed this year. The team competed online in building and testing events against other Orange County high schools in life, physical, earth, computer, and environmental sciences. The team finished 26 th this year.

ELECTIVES AND CLUBS

Drama	The MVHS Drama Program produces award winning productions and participates in numerous festivals each year. Our students consistently are recipients of state and national awards including Cappies, JRays, and CETA.
Marching Band & Color Guard	MVHS Marching Band, Color Guard and Drumline compete in Class 2A of the Western Band Association. They are consistent winners of both state and national titles.
Concert Ensembles	The MVHS Concert Ensembles are part of the Southern California School Band and Orchestra Association. Students perform in four concerts a year as well as various festivals in the Spring and are frequent award winners.
Choral Music	The MVHS Choral Program has performed in Carnegie Hall multiple times, and participated in the CMEA State Choral Festival several years running. Our Chamber Singers, Treble Choir, and Concert Choir consistently earn Unanimous Superior ratings. Chamber Singers, Treble Choir, and Diablo Singers are Gold Award recipients many times over.
