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#### Message from the Principal

Now is truly a great time to be a Diablo! I am excited to share with you the wonderful events highlighted in this issue. MVHS is ranked nationally in U.S. News and World Report and recently received an "A" rating in Niche 2024 Best High Schools in America. According to Niche, they rank 100,000 schools and districts based on data and millions of opinions of student and parents. We are grateful to be recognized in various outlets for academic excellence and we are proud of our students, faculty, and staff for their hard work and dedication to high standards. The California School Dashboard, the state's accountability system, released data and MVHS performed very well. English Language Arts students scored 71.8 points above standard which is the largest increase for the school in years! Math increased by 35 points, and the English Learner Progress increased by 26.9 points. Although our suspension rate maintained, we did move to the color performance level of yellow. In


short, this valuable school data is

used to calibrate the instructional

decisions we make to improve

student learning, achievement,

and focus on areas in need of improvement. I am proud to share with you that we are continuing our work on equity and inclusion with the goal of an equitable learning environment. MVHS started a Best Buddies program, which runs as a student friendship club. Students with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) to meet monthly, socialize, and develop friendships. A shout out of praise to our ML Coordinator Mrs. Pita Dargavel. She serves as the liaison between the district, MVHS admin, and teachers to ensure effective and equitable learning opportunities for Multilingual Learners. Mrs. Dargavel is truly exceptional and in one year reclassified 32 students as fluent English speakers!

Over the past year and a half, we have reviewed and revised our school's Mission and Vision as well as





The Mission Viejo Marching Band has finally wrapped up their season at the Western Band Association Championships, winning 3rd place in their division, and bringing home caption awards of High Percussion and High Auxiliary. Their show, "Star-Crossed Lovers," featured music from Tchaikovsky's "Overture to Romeo and Juliet," as well as Leonard Bernstein's "West Side Story" to tell the story of how hope perseveres in the face of opposition and adversity.

Preparation for this season began with weekly clinics for musicians in July, as students shook off the summer dust from their instruments and learned to work together as ensemble musicians. This year's group of students featured a large freshman class - an astounding 40% of the marching band experienced their first year in the program this seas

# **Engineering**

JPL Invention Challenge Final contest was held and MVHS Advanced Engineering students made the trek to JPL in Pasadena. Under bright sunshine and a calm wind, we had one of the most entertaining contests in years. The variety of inventions was remarkable and the JPL employees/volunteers were outstanding.

This year's contest was very challenging and many teams that participated did not complete the challenge. They either did not complete the milestones of a working prototype, or their contraption did not work as planned, or had to withdraw because of lack of planning. Those school teams that managed to overcome obstacles were invited to the finals at JPL.

MVHS represented well and beat out more than half of the original competition of 150 + teams. We earned 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> place overall, and secured the coveted award of Most Unusual Entry. It

was unusual in that the contraption employed many different uses of potential and kinetic energies such as gravity, springs, pulleys, teeter/totter, ramps, inclined planes, swinging pendulums, elastic bands, push pins, and even hot wheels cars and race track. A lot of the other groups in the competition used only 2 or 3 types of energy to complete the task.

# Oceanography

Oceanography is making a splash with some old haunts and new adventures. We undertook our first annual field trip of the year to Scripps Aquarium in San Diego on October 23<sup>rd</sup>. Our next trip is the Aliso Creek/Dana Point Beach Cleanup on January 11<sup>th</sup> followed by our big excursion to Toyon Bay, Catalina for our 3 day, 2 night extravaganza at the end of March.



We love to innovate and continue to build up our program, so this year introduced the Wave Simulation lab which allowed students to harness the plunger method of wave generation



observed at the California Science Center in LA and Monterey Aquariums. We've also recently joined up with Poseidon Education (unrelated to the desalination plant) to take action against ocean pollution. We have targeted five storm drains for focus in our report to the local water districts and EPA. This program is a beginning internship with a focus on broadly applicable skills and offers a more direct and tangible tie-in to possible careers through this field of study. We are starting with one class piloting this program and hope to more fully incorporate this next year.
