


Chemistry Formulas in the DNA



MVHS sophomore Rowan Weiss was recognized by the OC American Chemical Society Education Committee. Rowan is the first year winner at the 57th annual American Chemical First Year Chemistry Test Awards Dinner. A total of 193 students from 27 high schools, both public and private, were registered to participate.

For more than 50 years, the American Chemical Society has recognized outstanding chemistry students who have participated in the ACS testing program. Rowan Weiss honors MVHS bringing his achievement home.

Building Bridges



Prior to the event day, the students prepared technical reports, display boards, presentations, and of course – they build their Popsicle stick bridges! The rules and specifications for bridge design change each year so it was critical that the students read through and follow all instructions.

On the day of the event, the Diablo students and their bridges felt the weight! Volunteers from the civil engineering profession and local college campuses served as judges testing the bridges; scoring technical papers, display boards, and presentations; hosting additional impromptu competitions; and gave tours. The competition is a great opportunity to emphasize the benefits of pursuing higher education and careers in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics while promoting the engineering profession in our community.



Congrats to Mr. Miranda and our Diablo students for taking home 12 medals in the Bridge Category, including the 2nd and 3rd places in Technical Report Writing as well as the 3rd place Problem Solving Activity.






Big Splash

Setting Sail For Adventure



MVHS' Oceanography program (former Marine Bio), set sail during arguably one of the stormiest and wettest years we've had in history on what is now our 18th voyage to Catalina Island Marine Institute (CIMI) for 3 wondrous days at the end of March. The trip over was thrilling with students actively experiencing both seas and swells as they

learned the differences as well as the physics of when they interact to create larger than predicted waves while safely aboard the Catalina King. Once

on the island, students settled into their bunks in the repurposed military barracks turned boys dormitory turned sea camp buildings of Bald Eagle and Barracuda. After a much earned lunch, students were whisked away to





assorted labs that focused on the local

marine life, island topography, and island ecology. Students went eeling (a catch and release technique of catching moray eels with squid, binder clips, and fishing poles) through a tidepool investigation lab after an immersive orientation snorkel which prepared our resilient group for the voluntary night snorkel. Most of the students chose to see the nightly bioluminescent phenomena as they braved the especially cold evening rather than do the astronomy hike which also offered unique views of the constellations and local terrain.

Our nocturnal snorkelers especially

appreciated the warmer water temperature phenomena of the ocean's heat capacity. Students how woke up early for our sunrise hike were also treated to a rare occurrence. Not only did we have a rainbow over camp, we had a DOUBLE RAINBOW! We had a little rain, which shied away the bison, but brought the local deer and foxes complete with a babbling brook to camp as well as a large pod of dolphins to our bay for those who kept their eyes pealed. Soon enough, our time on the island had come to an end and we enjoyed one last pod of dolphins on our way back with smooth sailing and a classic California



touch of traffic. It was such a pleasure having such an amazing, resilient, and fun group of Catalina campers who carried the tradition well. We look forward to our next crew March 27-29 of 2024!

UCI Medical Outreach

Our Anatomy/Physiology teacher, Lisa Miller was able to gain access to a wonderful opportunity with our students. The much sought after fieldtrip offered by the Department of Urology at the University of California, Irvine {UCI) finally moved her from the waitlist. UCI touts itself for being passionate about giving back to the next generation and inspiring young minds to search out new possibilities for their future. Since 2008, UCI has held the Orange County High School Outreach Program designed for mature high school students, 15 years and older, who have excelled academically and may have an interest in the health sciences. This unique half day program allows students to gain hands-on experience in the medical field, which includes:

- 5O-minute didactic session on concepts in creativity and the progress being made in the realm of surgery with regard to innovation in less invasive surgery and advances in computer technology. This lecture is provided by a world renown surgeon and medical device innovator. A student focused question and answer period follows the presentation.
- Individual student hands-on laboratory experience with a highly motivated team of instructors; skills taught include surgical knot tying, endoscopic exercises, laparoscopic skills, and robotic suturing. A daVinci surgical robot is in the laboratory and each student has an opportunity to operate the robot.
- Complimentary breakfast and lunch during which time students have the opportunity to speak with
 various people committed to the health sciences: premed undergraduates, medical students, residents
 and/or surgical fellows.


