Newsletter! It is hard to believe that the winter break is almost here and we are well underway into the 2019/20 school year. I am excited to share with you the wonderful events highlighted in this issue. MVHS stands out as one of the top high schools in the nation by various publications and I was thrilled to hear that our score on Niche.com is an A+ with Mission placed in the top 10% for College Prep High Schools, top 6% for Best Public High Schools, and top 2% for Best Schools for Student Athletes. Our ACT and SAT scores are consistently above the California and National average and 91% of our graduates enter institutions of higher learning. The International Baccalaureate (IB) Class of 2019 received 47 full diplomas. They are attending colleges, such as UC Berkeley, UCLA, UCSD, USC, UC Santa Barbara, UC Davis, MIT, and Johns Hopkins. It is our goal for all students to achieve success and graduate from MVHS prepared for college and career. We are thankful that our wonderful alum share their positive experiences about this amazing school.

Our co-curricular programs remain strong. The Marching Band and Color guard recently returned from the WBA Championships held in Fresno where they took 1st place. The school's athletic program saw the Varsity Football team capture another South Coast League title and made it into the semifinals of the CIF Division 1 playoffs. MVHS Football is ranked 5th in the state and 16th nationally. The Boys' Varsity Water Polo Team won the CIF Southern Section Boys' Water Polo Division 5 Championship! They continued on to win the CIF Regional State Championships! We are proud of the success of our studentathletes.

The MVHS Drama Program continues to receive numerous awards for their stellar productions including "The Complete Works of William Shakespeare (abridged)" and "Unloved." The Choral Music program continues to be recognized for superior performances and will travel to Washington in the spring to compete in the Worldstrides competition. MUN is busy planning their prestigious 37th annual conference held in January and they will head to New York City in the spring. We are proud of the accomplishments of our wonderful students and value the outstanding staff who support them.


Safe Schools Challenge Winners!

Feeling the Spirit





upgrades each year. Classrooms have whiteboard desks of varying heights, stools, rolling chairs, yoga balls, and a wireless voice amplification system that allows the


teacher to move throughout the class with more ease and freedom. Innovative classrooms provide more opportunities for teachers to facilitate student learning, engagement, and collaboration.




LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION

On the second day, they brought a water quality testing, water cycle impacts, and mobile aquarium stations for students to further immerse into the sources of our water. As a follow-up, Mission's students created water conservation education presentations for representatives from the Municipal Water District of Orange County and the Bolsa Chica Conservancy.
