ELD/SDAIE LANGUAGE AND LITERACY COACH

DEFINITION:

Under the direction of the Director of the Services for English Learners Department and/or the school site administrator, to provide consultation, staff development, and instructional support to K-12 teachers and school leadership site teams as well as promote EL students' English language proficiency and academic literacy skills.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Provide staff development, mentoring, modeling, and coaching in ELD and SDAIE, with a focus on implementing effective research-based instructional strategies.
- Observe classroom instruction and provide constructive feedback to teachers.
- Help define, teach and refine units of study aligned with the ELD and content area standards.
- Support collaboration among teachers at school sites.
- Act as a resource for teachers and recommend appropriate EL instructional materials, demonstration lessons and technological support.
- Assist site personnel with formative ongoing EL student assessment and analysis of student progress.
- Attend trainings/inservices for ELD/SDAIE Language and Literacy Coaches and site staff.
- Meet regularly with the site administrator to discuss data and the EL program implementation.
- · Meet regularly with site administrators and district staff.
- Collaborate with Services for English Learners Department Resource Teachers, ELD/SDAIE Language Coaches and Academic/Instructional Coaches.
- Assist site staff with communication with the parents of English learners about the US educational system's structure and requirements for graduation

QUALIFICATIONS:

Knowledge of:

Effective research-based practices in ELD and SDAIE; differentiation strategies to meet the academic needs of diverse student populations; techniques and methods for peer coaching to improve students' academic achievement; basic knowledge of comparative linguistics; and use of data to evaluate student achievement and programs.

Ability to:

Assist teachers and the site administrator in providing and monitoring an effective ELD/SDAIE Language and Literacy Program at selected school sites; communicate effectively, both orally and in writing; establish and maintain effective coaching relationships; analyze instructional problems/issues and utilize appropriate strategies to help resolve them; understand and carry out directions with minimal assistance; utilize technology as a tool for instruction, communication, recordkeeping, and data collection/analysis.

Experience:

Minimum of three years of successful classroom teaching, including knowledge of and training in the unique needs of English Learner students. In-depth training in ELD/SDAIE and literacy development. Recent training and experience (minimum 2 years) in coaching/mentoring, such as Support Provider, Master Teacher, Program Specialist, or Resource Teacher. Bilingual skills preferred.
