Range 90 Community Services and Child Care Services Exempt Salary Schedule

COMMUNITY SERVICES LEADER II

DEFINITION

Under general supervision, plan, direct and coordinate a variety of community services programs and activities; work directly with children in the implementation of these programs; and perform related work as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Duties assigned may include all or some of the following: assist with training, as well as coordinating the activities of the Community Services Leaders and volunteers; assist in the planning and coordination of specific programs and participants at a community services program site; may be responsible for opening and/or closing a community services facility; maintain inventory, records and supplies; protect school property and equipment; planning for and processing class registration; and may assist with the preparation of news releases and marketing articles and information.

QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge of

Programs offered by the Community Services Department; Community Services Division policies and procedures; basic rules of community services sports and games; a community based community services program philosophy; skills necessary to teach participants.

Ability to

Plan, coordinate and implement community services programs and activities; help coordinate the activities of Community Services Leaders and volunteers; operate standard office machines and computers; prepare accurate registration, financial and attendance records; maintain and establish cooperative working relationships; apply judgment, discretion and initiative; express ideas in both written and verbal form; and understand and carry out oral and written directions.

Certificates

Must maintain current First Aid and CPR card, if required.

Experience

One year of community services program experience.

Education

Completion of the eleventh grade preferred.

Physical Performance Requirements

Standing or walking most of the time. Correctly lift 50 pounds alone or more with assistance. May be required to lift a child upon occasion. The physical activities that may be done on a daily basis include, but are not limited to, set-up and breakdown of site supply box, tables, chairs, booth frames, helium tanks, boxes, canopies and other related activity and special event equipment. When working with staff and/or students, some activities will require the person to squat, sit on the floor/ground, stoop, kneel, bend or reach.

<u>Licenses</u>

Possession of a valid California Driver's License, if required.

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
