SENIOR COMMUNITY SERVICES PROGRAM SPECIALIST

DEFINITION

Under general direction, to develop, plan, organize and conduct multiple community services programs, classes, or activities; coordinate the operations and assignments of Community Services Leaders and volunteers; perform various clerical duties; supervise offsite activities; and to perform related work as required.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Develop, coordinate, and maintain multiple community services programs, classes or activities, including staff scheduling, supply ordering, and equipment replacement; enforce District policies, procedures, and regulations; assist with training of Community Services Leaders; evaluate programs; prepare press releases and publicity materials; act as community liaison.

QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge of

Community Services programs offered by the Department; Community Services Division policies and procedures; community based program philosophy; training and motivation techniques; rules of various games and sports.

Ability to

Plan, coordinate, and conduct community services programs and activities; coordinate multiple programs, including vehicles, staff, and equipment; prepare accurate reports and statistics; establish and maintain cooperative working relationships within the community; apply judgment, discretion, and initiative; clearly express ideas both verbally and in writing; follow directions.

Certifications

Must maintain a current First Aid and CPR card. Valid Class C drivers license and ability to obtain a Class B license.

Experience:

Two years of increasing responsibility in a community services position or related field, with emphasis in specific community services program area.

Education:

AA degree or equivalent units; three years of work experience may be substituted for education requirement.

Physical Performance Requirements:

Standing or walking 90% of the time; correctly lift 50 pounds alone or more with assistance; set-up and break down of tables, chairs, games, canopies, and other program related supplies.
