

## **FOOD SERVICE DELIVERY WORKER**

### DEFINITION

Under immediate supervision, to load and deliver centrally prepared foods and supplies to schools; to load, unload, open, stack and rotate food stock and supplies; and to do related work as required.

### EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Load and deliver foods and supplies and return empty delivery containers to central kitchen; operate refrigerated delivery truck; follow prescribed delivery and pick-up schedule; load and unload kitchen warehouse stock; may assist in receiving kitchen merchandise; maintain food service area, facilities and equipment in a clean and sanitary condition; keep simple records; operate equipment for handling and storing stock, including pallet and forklift.

### QUALIFICATIONS

#### Knowledge of

District geography; standard loading and delivery procedures; methods of storing and rotating foodstuffs and supplies.

#### Ability to

Possess a valid and appropriate California Driver's License; load, unload and carry objects and varying weights; safely operate a truck or van, and other equipment for handling and storing stock; understand and carry out oral and written instructions; establish and maintain cooperative working relationships.

#### Experience

One year of delivery or related experience which has provided the applicant with the knowledge and abilities listed above.

#### Education

Equivalent to the completion of the twelfth grade.

#### Physical Performance Requirements

Frequent lifting and maneuvering of up to 50 to 60 pounds, with occasional lifting and maneuvering of up to 100 pounds with or without assistance. Frequent standing or walking much of the time with twisting, bending, stooping, and squatting. May work on irregular surfaces or at heights above the ground.

#### Licenses

Possession of a valid and appropriate California Driver's License.
