X.a. Coastline Regional Occupational Program (CROP) Report

Minutes:

Trustee Schulman provided a Coastline ROP report. After-bell classes have successfully opened in the Irvine, Saddleback Valley, and Tustin Unified School Districts with extensive planning for safety for all. Coastline ROP coordinated the cleaning of classrooms with each of the districts and provided cleaning kits for additional sanitizing if needed. The students and instructors are all wearing masks and are physically distancing.

The classes at the Presidio campus have reopened with the same safeguards and fantastic attendance. The animal health care pathway, one of Coastline ROP's most in-demand programs, is doing cohort meetings with Darlene Mitcheltree

Minutes:

Trustee Schulman began her comments by congratulating SVUSD's re-elected Board members. Being a Board member is a very difficult position. She thanked President Wong, Trustee Swartz, and Trustee Morrell for running again and continuing forward with their dedication, hard work, and determination with all they do for the students, families, and staff in SVUSD.

As a Board, they put forward their thoughts and efforts to try to make as many people, the budget, and all of their constituents upper most in their minds, thoughts, and votes.

She thanked all the teachers for their dedication and hard work and the classified staff for all the work they do for our students. She thanked Food Services, for all the meals they have prepared and served and the custodians who have worked hard to keep our schools clean, especially for the work that needed to be done after the fires. Also, she thanked the many teachers who have allowed her to watch their classes virtually.

Nothing could have made her prouder than receiving the awards from the Parenting OC Magazine. She wants everyone to notice that we are the best among public and charter schools. It is an incredible honor to receive these awards. She'd like parents, families, and neighborhood friends to understand how important this is. Going to a private or charter school is your choice and right, but our high school, Mission Viejo High School, and intermediate school, Rancho Santa Margarita, won in these categories. Our District won for the best Public District. SVUSD has the finest teachers, curriculum, families and students in Orange County.

She is thankful that she and the other members of the Board can continue to serve the best district in Orange County.

Trustee Kunath commented that he was very gratified when listening to the Student Board Member, Madison Goseco's, report. He is grateful for all of the great things that are going on in the District and at all of our schools.

Trustee Swartz commented on the achievement of SVUSD being voted the best school district in Orange County which is a tribute to the staff, teachers, students, parents, and community. She acknowledged SVUSD's teachers for their dedication and adapting during the fires to continue to provide instruction. She congratulated Esports and Shane Bieber, a Laguna Hills High School graduate from the class of 2013, who won the American League Cy Young award by a unanimous vote.

Trustee Morrell appreciates Trustee Schulman's comments. During the fires, she was evacuated and went to a hotel for 4 days. She learned first-hand how much our

students need to adapt and appreciates how much teachers continue to go above and beyond. This is a trying time for everyone and we're all learning.

President Wong commended the maintenance and custodial staff for their hard work to get schools ready for students after being closed due to the fires. He is very proud of SVUSD for receiving the Parenting OC awards. He visited three school sites and was very impressed with how teachers are providing instruction to our students in person and virtually.

Superintendent Turner clarified that if Orange County goes back to the COVID-19 Purple Tier that we will not need to close our schools. She participated in the Fourth District PTA Superintendent's Forum and has had an opportunity to begin her site visits. She had the opportunity to stay for a few periods at one site where it was evident that every child knew their teacher cared about them. The teachers are doing a phenomenal job whether it's online or in the classroom. She is thankful and proud to be the Superintendent in SVUSD.
