



Reopening Update #16; November 19, 2020

Dear SVUSD Community,

As we head into Thanksgiving break, I wanted to take a moment to wish everyone a restful week off. I also wanted to provide some important updates and reminders regarding health and safety protocols, and the effects of Orange County's move back into the purple tier.

As I shared in [update #15](#) on Monday, Orange County was placed back into the purple tier of the state's COVID-19 monitoring system, however, schools that had previously opened for in-person instruction are able to continue operating. As such, all SVUSD schools will continue to offer both the Hybrid Learning model of instruction and Distance Learning.

With the move into the purple tier comes additional guidance, and also an opportunity to reiterate some important health and safety protocols aimed at mitigating the risk of COVID-19 transmission:

Face Coverings

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) recently updated requirements for face coverings. **All visitors, employees, and students are required to wear face coverings at all times.** The new guidance can be found at:

The CDPH has issued a travel advisory recommending a self-quarantine for 14 days when traveling outside of California or entering our state. At this time, this guidance is a recommendation. SVUSD COVID-19 Investigations and Notification Letters

Upon receiving notification that a student or employee tests positive for the coronavirus or is a close contact, the District Office begins a contact tracing investigation in conjunction with the Orange County Health Care Agency (OCHCA). When the investigation is completed, the District sends a series of letters to individuals and the community as well as updating the SVUSD COVID-19 Case Reporting Dashboard. We update the COVID-19 Case Reporting Dashboard

daily on business days. The Dashboard can be found at:

The letters sent include a *Community Notification* letter that goes to all members of the school community informing them that a COVID-19 positive individual was on campus. Students and staff who possibly came in contact with the individual in areas such as a classroom, outdoor area, in transportation, or on campus receive a *Low Risk Exposure* letter. Finally, students who came in close contact with the individual receive a *Close Contact* letter informing them to quarantine for 14 days.
